

Welcome to Manhood visits Edwards Air Force Base!

"Providing Guidance, Support, and Encouragement" On Thursday July 6, 2017, a group of CBMLA mentors and mentees participated in a field trip to Edwards Air Force Base in Lancaster, CA for a guided tour of several airplane hangars and as well as to view the aircraft in those hangars. Of greatest interest was the RQ-4 Global Hawk, an unmanned surveillance aircraft (UAV). The Global Hawk is operated by the United States Air Force, used as a high-altitude platform covering the spectrum of intelligence collection capability to support forces in worldwide military operations.
